What To Bring/Pack In Your Trailer

Aside from bits, bridles and boots, you'll need to pack items in your truck and trailer that will help you be properly prepared for anything. Creating an item list for either a long or short trip keeps avoidable mishaps and forgotten goods to a minimum. Below is a checklist of suggested items.

THE TRAILER

Equine first-aid kit
Three emergency triangles/flares
Chocks (safety devices to prevent tires from rolling)
Flashlight with spare batteries
Electrical tape and duct tape
Knife
Water (5-20 gal)
Buckets/sponge
Spare halter and lead rope
Spare light bulbs
Spare fuses if applicable
Fire extinguisher
WD-40 or other lubricant
Broom, shovel, fork, manure disposal bags
Insect spray

TOW VEHICLE

Vehicle and trailer registration
Proof of insurance
Jumper cables
Spare tire/jack/tire iron
Tool kit
Spare belts and hoses
Tow chain
Cell phone or CB radio
Replacement fuses
Road atlas
Work gloves
Extra cash/credit card
Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)
Portable air compressor
Proof of negative Coggins test
